Each of the programmes aims to achieve long-term positive impacts on children's behaviour. <i>Incredible Years Limerick</i> was established in 2007 and was initially implemented in three locations in Limerick City.

VIP Programme	Get Back Challenge - This is a programme where 15 young people from the Regeneration areas were selected to take part in a course, that allows them to achieve 4 coaching awards and they volunteer for 3 hours a week, in relevant organisations and groups throughout the city. The culmination of this course will be the young people representing Limerick City Regeneration areas, at the World scholar games and world peace initiative in the USA, in June 2011.											
SimpleIT	Short jargon-free workshops offering introductions to technology. They are free and fun and focus on the practical skills needed for today's world. They were run throughout Limerick City in 2009 and mainstreamed as part of LCAES provision in 2010. LCC plan to build on the experience of SimpleIT in 2011 to develop additional relevant workshops.											
Language Fair	Funding from the Office of the Minister for Integration for a major Language Fair for Limerick City and County. The aim will be to engage all people who experience difficulty in accessing services or fully participating in the economic, social, cultural and political life of Limerick due to language. The target group will be migrant communities, people with literacy or language difficulties, service providers. It will be held in Thomond Park on June 18 <sup>th</sup> and will consist of dynamic zones engaging participants with different aspects of language.
